# Definition of Interjection

**Interjection is a word that expresses a strong feeling.** It is just a sort of exclamation. Each interjection has its own specific connotation. The listener of an interjection instantly understands the emotions of the speaker.

#### **Examples**

- Wow! wonderful.
- Alas! I'm lost in the wilderness.
- Ugh! That was a total waste of time.



# TYPES OF INTERJECTION

- 1 INTERJECTION FOR GREETING
- 2 INTERJECTION FOR JOY
- 3 INTERJECTION FOR APPROVAL
- 4 INTERJECTION FOR SURPRISE
- 5 INTERJECTION FOR SORROW

### INTERJECTION FOR GREETING

These interjections are uttered to greet someone.

## **Examples**

Hello, hey, hi, etc.

- Hello, can I help you with something?
- **Hey**, listen to me.
- **Hi**, how may I help?



### INTERJECTION FOR JOY

These interjections are uttered to express joy and happiness.

### **Examples**

Hurrah, hurray, wow, etc.

- Hurray! I have won the race.
- Wow! My son has passed the exam.
- Hurrah! We've got another day off.



#### INTERJECTION FOR APPROVAL AND PRAISE

These interjections express the feelings of admiration and praises.

# **Examples**

Bravo, Brilliant, well done, etc.

- Well done! You have succeeded.
- Bravo! He has made a great goal.
- Brilliant! You have got high marks in the exam.



#### INTERJECTION FOR SURPRISE

These interjections show the speaker's feelings of surprise.

# **Examples**

What, oh, ah, eh, wow, etc.

- Ah! It feels good.
- Oh! You both know each other.
- What! He died.
- Wow! It is tasty.



#### INTERJECTION FOR SORROW

These interjections express the speaker's feelings of sadness.

### **Examples**

Alas, ah, oh, ouch, etc.

- Look! Don't be so boastful.
- Listen! I will never go with you.
- Behold! Something strange has happened.
